

2024-2025 Transfer Scholarships and Financial Aid

A University of Mississippi education is an exceptional investment in your future. The Office of Financial Aid at Ole Miss can provide all of the information you need to understand the various financial aid programs available.

We offer everything from academic merit-based scholarships to need-based scholarships. Most transfer scholarships are available for up to 2 years, and require a minimum of 30 transferable college credit hours. Some of them are awarded automatically, based on your academic credentials – without having to apply for them.

There is also a competitive scholarship application specifically for students who are transferring directly to our school from a Community College. It can be found online at olemiss.edu/apply. For students who plan to attend the Oxford campus, it opens December 1, 2023, with a priority submission date of March 1, 2024. It is already open for the regional campuses (Tupelo, DeSoto, Grenada, Booneville, and Rankin). **This application will close for ALL campuses after April 1, 2024.** Other application deadlines can be found below.

Federal and State Aid Options

Some families may need to consider grants, student and parent loans, or student employment in addition to scholarships to help meet the cost of attending the university. It's important to understand how all types of financial aid work and what steps you can take now to plan ahead. We recommend that you complete the FAFSA each year at studentaid.gov for federal aid eligibility and, if a Mississippi resident, that you also apply for state financial aid at msfinancialaid.org. Special Programs

Students with outstanding academic and leadership records may wish to apply for the Sally McDonnell Barksdale Honors College, Croft International Studies, Lott Leadership Institute, the Haley Barbour Center for Manufacturing Excellence, and the Mississippi Excellence in Teaching Program. Lyceum Scholar Award

Award Amount: Full resident tuition for two years (\$9,252 for the 2023-24 year)

ELIGIBILITY: Community College Transfer students with at least a 3.0 transfer GPA on at least 30 transferable college credit hours and an exemplary record of leadership and service.

HOW TO APPLY: Complete the Community College Transfer Scholarship Application.

Community College Leadership Scholarship

Award Amount: \$6,000 (\$3,000 per year for two years)

ELIGIBILITY: Community College Transfer students with at least a 3.0 transfer GPA on at least 30 transferable college credit hours and an exemplary record of leadership and service.

HOW TO APPLY: Complete the Community College Transfer Scholarship Application.

Community College Student Body President

Award Amount: \$3,000 (\$1,500 per year for two years)

ELIGIBILITY: Community College Transfer students who served in the top elected position at their Community College. These scholarships are awarded to community college transfer students with a 3.0 overall transfer GPA or higher and at least 30 transferable college credit hours.

HOW TO APPLY: No separate application required; students must provide documentation of credential to the Office of Financial Aid or fax a copy to 662-915-1164. Confirmation must be received within the first term of enrollment.

Eagle Scout/Gold Award

Award Amount: \$3,000 (\$1,500 per year for two years)

ELIGIBILITY: New transfer students who have achieved the levels of Eagle Scout or Gold Award.

HOW TO APPLY: No separate application required; students must provide documentation of credential to the Office of Financial Aid or fax a copy to 662-915-1164. Confirmation must be received within the first term of enrollment.

Sumners Scholarship

Award Amount: \$8,000 per year

This scholarship is automatically offered to residents of the following MS counties: Attala, Carroll, Choctaw, Montgomery, or Webster. The Sumners Foundation verifies residency via their own application. May be enrolled part-time.

UM Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

Award Amount: \$4,000 (\$2,000 per year for two years)

ELIGIBILITY: Transfer students with a GPA of 3.25 or higher on at least 30 transferable college credit hours and membership in Phi Theta Kappa. This award can be stacked with Transfer Academic Merit Scholarships. Members of the All-Mississippi Team will receive an additional one-time only \$1,000 scholarship and an additional \$1,000 one-time only scholarship will be awarded to those students who become members of the All-USA Team. Nonresidents will receive an additional \$4,000 per year for two years toward the nonresident fee.

HOW TO APPLY: No separate application required; PTK can be indicated on official transcript or students may bring a copy of the PTK membership card to the Office of Financial Aid, or fax a copy to 662-915-1164. Confirmation must be received within the first term of enrollment.

Phi Theta Kappa President

Award Amount: \$2,000 (\$1,000 per year for two years)

ELIGIBILITY: Community College Transfer students who served as the President of Phi Theta Kappa at their Community College. These scholarships are awarded to community college transfer students with a 3.25 overall transfer GPA or higher and at least 30 transferable college credit hours.

HOW TO APPLY: No separate application required; students must provide documentation of credential to the Office of Financial Aid or fax a copy to 662-915-1164. Confirmation must be received within the first term of enrollment.

New Century Scholarship

Award Amount: Full resident tuition for two years (\$9,252 for the 2023-24 year)

ELIGIBILITY: Transfer students with a 3.0 overall transfer GPA who have been named a New Century Scholar by the PTK Honor Society. Nonresident students will receive an additional scholarship to cover their full nonresident fee for two years (\$17,568 for the 2023-24 year).

HOW TO APPLY: No separate application required; students must provide documentation of credential to the Office of Financial Aid or fax a copy to 662-915-1164. Confirmation must be received within the first term of enrollment.

Transfer Academic Merit Scholarship 1

Award Amount: \$8,000 (\$4,000 per year for two years)

ELIGIBILITY: These scholarships are awarded to transfer students with a 3.0 – 3.49 overall transfer GPA and at least 30 transferable college credit hours.

HOW TO APPLY: Students must complete the University of Mississippi admissions application. There is no additional application required.

Transfer Academic Merit Scholarship 2

Award Amount: \$12,000 (\$6,000 per year for two years)

ELIGIBILITY: These scholarships are awarded to transfer students with a 3.5 or higher overall transfer GPA and at least 30 transferable college credit hours. Nonresidents will receive an additional \$3,000 per year for two years toward the nonresident fee.

HOW TO APPLY: Students must complete the University of Mississippi admissions application. There is no additional application required.

Osher Reentry Scholarship

Award Amount: Up to \$2,500 per year (\$1,250 per semester)

ELIGIBILITY: Students who are pursuing their first baccalaureate degree; have experienced a cumulative gap in their education of five or more years since High School graduation or attainment of GED; who are enrolled at least half-time, are between 25 and 50 years old; and have demonstrated financial need as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

HOW TO APPLY: Apply for admission and complete the online Osher Reentry Scholarship Application, which opens March 1. The submission deadline is June 30. Students must have a completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on file with the Office of Financial Aid by June 1st.

MISSISSIPPI RESIDENTS

Mississippi Community College Advantage Scholarship

Award Amount: \$10,000 (\$5,000 per year for two years)

ELIGIBILITY: Community College transfer students who are MS residents with at least 48 transferable college credit hours and at least a 2.5 or higher overall transfer GPA. Students must be eligible for a Federal Pell Grant and have a family adjusted gross income of \$40,000 or less as reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This is a competitive scholarship and 50 awards are made each year.

HOW TO APPLY: To be considered for this scholarship, transfer students must file a FAFSA (priority deadline is March 1). Priority will be given to students who complete the online Community College Transfer Scholarship Application.

Luckyday

Award Amount: \$12,000 (up to \$6,000 per year for two years)

ELIGIBILITY: These scholarships are awarded to a select group of 25 community college transfer students with a 2.5 overall GPA on at least 48 transferable college credit hours. Students receiving this award must be residents of Mississippi and must be transferring from a Mississippi community college. In addition, students selected must have remaining financial need as determined by the Free Application for Federal student Aid (FAFSA) after other scholarships and grants have been awarded.

HOW TO APPLY: To be considered for this scholarship, transfer students must file the FAFSA by March 1 and complete the online Community College Transfer Scholarship Application by April 1.

Cost of Attendance

The Cost of Attendance (COA) is an estimate of how much it could cost to attend our institution when you take into account all related expenses. Direct Costs are billed by Ole Miss, and Indirect Costs are realistic allowances for other expenses you should anticipate.

Direct Costs/Billed Expenses:

Tuition, Capital Improvements Fee, Student Activity Fee, Housing, Food

Indirect Costs:

Books/Supplies, Personal, Travel

NONRESIDENTS

Alumni Scholarship

Award Amount: For students entering the University for the first time beginning Fall 2024, \$6,000 per year toward the nonresident fee with a transfer GPA between 2.5 and 2.99 OR \$8,000 per year toward the nonresident fee with a transfer GPA between 3.0 and higher.

ELIGIBILITY: Nonresident students whose parent(s) received a degree from the university.

Can be used for up to two parents.

HOW TO APPLY: Print the application from the Office of Financial Aid website (finaid.olemiss.edu/scholarships) and then click on "Other Scholarships".

Veteran and Military Nonresident Scholarships

Award Amount: Full Nonresident Fee

ELIGIBILITY: Awarded for either full-time or part-time enrollment to:

Students who have been engaged in and honorably discharged from active duty, for other than training purposes, in the U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, or Coast Guard, OR

Nonveteran students who receive veterans education benefits (as defined by the U.S. code, Title 38) as service members, OR

Students who receive veterans education benefits (as defined by the U.S. code, Title 38) as an eligible family member with transferred benefits.

HOW TO APPLY: Contact the Veteran & Military Services Office. Qualifying veteran students should provide a DD214.
