Orientation

All transfer students must attend an orientation session to prepare for enrollment at the university. At Ole Miss, orientation includes academic advising and registration for classes, so it is an essential part of starting your college career. Applying for Housing

Students must gain admission to the university before applying for housing. Admission for housing is offered throughout the year on a rolling basis (beginning in mid-October for summer or fall applicants). Students with at least 30 transferrable hours may choose to live on or off campus as space allows. On-campus housing for transfer students is limited at the University of Mississippi. Student housing applications are available online for admitted and enrolled students. Applying for Admission



Transfer students may be admitted under one of the following conditions:

Earn an associate's degree intended for transfer to a four-year school from an accredited community college with a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade-point average (GPA) as calculated by the University of Mississippi.

Meet resident freshman admissions requirements and have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA as calculated by the University of Mississippi on transferrable credit from a regionally accredited college or university.

Have a 2.0 cumulative GPA as calculated by the University of Mississippi on all transferrable credit AND have successfully completed the following 30 semester hours with a 2.0 GPA at a regionally accredited school:

6 semester hours of English Composition

3 semester hours of College Algebra, Quantitative Reasoning or a higher level math

6 semester hours of Laboratory Science

9 semester hours of Humanities and Fine Arts

6 semester hours of Social or Behavioral Sciences

Submit an online application by visiting olemiss.edu/applynow. Applications will be processed once all materials and the fee have been received. A \$40 application fee for Mississippi residents or \$60 application fee for nonresidents is required.

Scholarships

To qualify for scholarships, students must be transferring directly from a community college and plan to enroll full time (unless otherwise indicated). The transfer GPA, as calculated by the University of Mississippi, will include grades from all prior colleges attended.

The following scholarships do not require a separate application:

Community College Academic Excellence 1 Scholarship

- **Award Amount:** \$6,000 (\$3,000 per year for two years)
- **Eligibility:** Awarded to community college transfer students with a 3.00–3.49 overall transfer GPA and 48 transferrable community college credit hours. Students must be enrolled full time to receive this award
- May be stacked with Phi Theta Kappa scholarship

Community College Academic Excellence 2 Scholarship

- **Award Amount:** \$8,000 (\$4,000 per year for two years)
- **Eligibility:** Awarded to community college transfer students with a 3.5 or higher overall transfer GPA and 48 transferrable community college credit hours. Students must be enrolled full time to receive this award. Nonresidents will receive an additional \$3,000 per year for two years toward the nonresident fee.
- May be stacked with Phi Theta Kappa scholarship

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

- **Award Amount:** \$8,000 (\$4,000 per year for two years)
- **Eligibility:** Transfer students with a 3.25 GPA on at least 48 transferrable community college credit hours and membership in Phi Theta Kappa. Members of the All-State Team receive an additional one-time-only \$1,000 scholarship, and an additional \$1,000 one-time-only scholarship is awarded to those students who become members of the All-USA Team. Nonresidents receive an additional \$4,000 per year for two years toward the nonresident fee.

Community College Student Body President

- **Award Amount:** \$3,000 (\$1,500 per year for two years)
- **Eligibility:** Community college transfer students who served in the top elected position at their community college. These scholarships are awarded to community college transfer students with 48 transferrable community college credit hours. Students must be enrolled full time to receive this award.

Phi Theta Kappa President

- **Award Amount:** \$2,000 (\$1,000 per year for two years)
- **Eligibility:** Community college transfer students who served as president of Phi Theta Kappa at their community college. These scholarships are awarded to community college transfer students with a 3.25 or higher overall transfer GPA and 48 transferrable community college credit hours. Students must be enrolled full time to receive this award.

Eagle Scout/Gold Award

- **Award Amount:** \$3,000 (\$1,500 per year for two years)
- **Eligibility:** Community college students who have achieved the levels of Eagle Scout or Gold Award

New Century Scholarship

- **Award Amount:** Full resident tuition for two years (fall and spring semesters). Nonresident students will receive an additional scholarship to cover their full nonresident fee for two years (fall and spring semesters).
- **Eligibility:** Transfer students with at least a 3.0 GPA and 48 transferrable community college credit hours and named a New Century Scholar

The following scholarships require the student to complete the Transfer Scholarship Application by March 1:

Community College Chancellor's Leadership Class

- **Award Amount:** \$1,000 (first year only)
- **Eligibility:** Students demonstrating strong leadership; must be selected by university committee

Community College Leadership Scholarship

- **Award Amount:** \$6,000 (\$3,000 per year for two years)
- **Eligibility:** Transfer students with at least a 3.0 GPA and 48 transferrable community college credit hours and an exemplary record of leadership and service. Must be selected by university committee.

Luckyday University Scholarship

- **Award Amount:** \$9,200 (up to \$4,600 per year)
- **Eligibility:** Awarded to a select group of 25 community college transfer students with a 2.5 or higher overall GPA on at least 48 transferrable community college credit hours. Students receiving this award must be Mississippi residents and must be transferring from a Mississippi community college. In addition, students selected must have remaining financial need as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) after other scholarships and grants have been awarded. Must also complete FAFSA by March 1.

Lyceum Scholars Award

- **Award Amount:** Full resident tuition per year for two years (fall and spring semesters)
- **Eligibility:** Transfer students with at least a 3.0 GPA and 48 transferrable community college credit hours and an exemplary record of leadership and service. Must be selected by university committee.

Mississippi Community College Advantage Scholarship

- **Award Amount:** \$10,000 (\$5,000 per year for two years)
- **Eligibility:** Community college transfer students who are Mississippi residents with at least 48 transferrable community college credit hours and a 2.5 or higher overall transfer GPA. Students must be eligible for a federal Pell Grant and have a family adjusted gross income of \$30,000 or less. This is a competitive scholarship, and 25 awards are offered each year. Must also complete FAFSA by March 1.

Students may generally stack scholarships up to their cost of attendance unless the award is paying a specific fee or restricted by financial need.

The following scholarships require separate applications that can be found online at finaid.olemiss.edu:

Osher Reentry Scholarship

- **Award Amount:** Up to \$2,500 per year (\$1,250 per semester)
- **Eligibility:** Students who are pursuing their first baccalaureate degree; have experienced a cumulative gap in their education of five or more years since high school graduation or attainment of GED; are enrolled at least half time, are U.S. citizens between 25 and 50 years old, and have demonstrated financial need as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FA)

Sumners Grant

- **Award Amount:** Up to \$5,000 per year (\$2,500 per semester)
- **Eligibility:** Must be a resident of Attala, Carroll, Choctaw, Montgomery or Webster counties in Mississippi and enrolled in a degree program. Part-time students are eligible. Student does not have to be transferring from a community college.

Nonresident Alumni Scholarship Award 1

- **Award Amount:** \$3,000 per year, per alumnus, toward out-of-state tuition
- **Eligibility:** Nonresident students whose parent(s) received a degree from the university. Student does not have to be transferring from a community college. 2.50-3.49 GPA

Nonresident Alumni Scholarship Award

- **Award Amount:** \$4,000 per year, per alumnus, toward out-of-state tuition
- **Eligibility:** Nonresident students whose parent(s) received a degree from the university. Student does not have to be transferring from a community college. 3.50+ GPA

The following scholarships require the student to contact the coordinator of Veteran and Military Services (vms.olemiss.edu):

Veterans Nonresident Scholarship

- **Award Amount:** Pays for the full nonresident fee. Part-time students are eligible.
- **Eligibility:** Awarded to students who have been engaged in and honorably discharged from active duty, for other than training purposes, in the U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines or Coast Guard. (Please note: Qualifying students will receive a Yellow Ribbon Nonresident Scholarship in lieu of the Veteran Nonresident Scholarship.) Student does not have to be transferring from a community college.

Military Benefit Nonresident Scholarship

- **Award Amount:** Pays for the full nonresident fee. Part-time students are eligible.
- **Eligibility:** Awarded to nonveteran students who receive veterans education benefits (as defined by the U.S. Code, Title 38) as service members or because they are an eligible family member with transferred benefits. These individuals will qualify for a scholarship that pays the full nonresident fee. (Please note: Qualifying students will receive a Yellow Ribbon Nonresident Scholarship in lieu of the Military Benefit Nonresident Scholarship.) Student does not have to be transferring from a community college.
